Family Partnership Process

- The Family Partnership Process is required by Head Start Performance Standards.

Family Partnership Process Requirements

- The Family Partnership Process includes supporting and collaborating with families in their interests, needs, aspirations and with a FPA goal.
- Staff and families should be working towards developing a strength-based goal together.



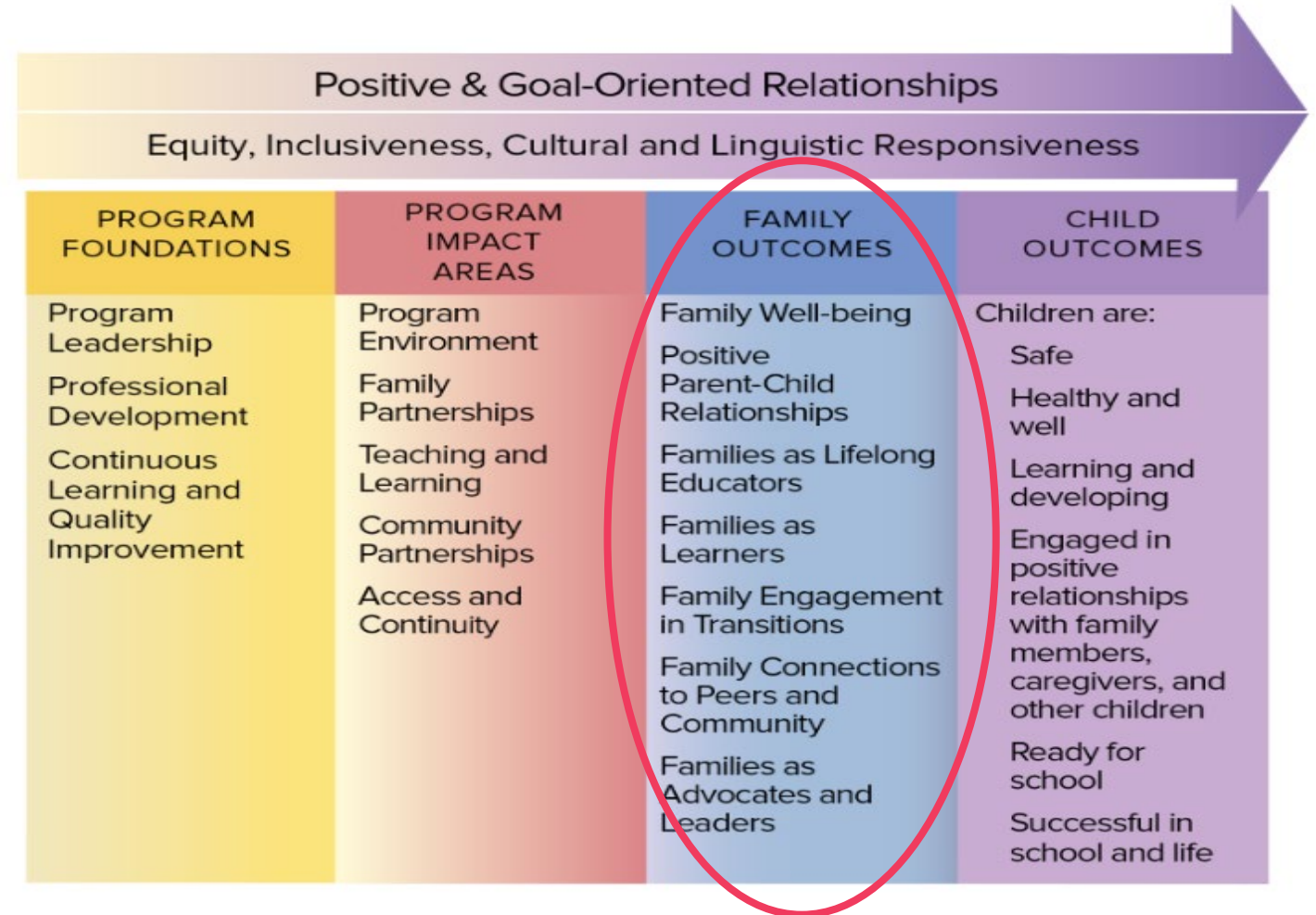
Family Partnership Process Requirements

- The Process must be initiated as early in the program as possible.
- The on-going process needs to be discussed & documented with each family throughout the year on an individualized basis.
- Family Strengths and Needs Assessment is also required to be completed with families.



Family Partnership Process Requirements

- The Assessment must identified family strengths and needs in all Family Outcomes areas, within the Head Start Parent, Family, & Community Engagement Framework.





Family Partnership Process Requirements

- This is a breakdown of the Family Outcomes section that will be utilized when setting family goals.

Head Start Parent and Family Engagement Outcomes	
1. FAMILY WELL-BEING	Parents and families are safe, healthy, and have increased financial security.
2. POSITIVE PARENT-CHILD RELATIONSHIPS	Beginning with transitions to parenthood, parents and families develop warm relationships that nurture their child's learning and development.
3. FAMILIES AS LIFELONG EDUCATORS	Parents and families observe, guide, promote, and participate in the everyday learning of their children at home, school, and in their communities.
4. FAMILIES AS LEARNERS	Parents and families advance their own learning interests through education, training and other experiences that support their parenting, careers, and life goals.
5. FAMILY ENGAGEMENT IN TRANSITIONS	Parents and families support and advocate for their child's learning and development as they transition to new learning environments, including EHS to HS, EHS/HS to other early learning environments, and HS to kindergarten through elementary school.
6. FAMILY CONNECTIONS TO PEERS AND COMMUNITY	Parents and families form connections with peers and mentors in formal or informal social networks that are supportive and/or educational and that enhance social well-being and community life.
7. FAMILIES AS ADVOCATES AND LEADERS	Parents and families participate in leadership development, decision-making, program policy development, or in community and state organizing activities to improve children's development and learning experiences.



Family Partnership Process Requirements

- The Family Strengths and Needs assessment data can be used to help set a Family Goal.
- The “Resource Tools” from the Family Service Credentialing training may also be used to help set appropriate, strength-based goals.



Family Partnership Process Requirements

- **Goals may change throughout the year as the family and the needs of the family change.**
- **Goals, actions, time lines and revisions should be made on a regular basis that meets the family's individual needs.**
- **A family may have more than one Family Goal completed throughout the program year.**



Family Partnership Process Requirements

- Duplication of services should be avoided.
- If a family is working towards a goal with another agency, support and document the goal. Do not create another goal, unless the family requests it.

Foster Families

- It is not required to complete a FPA or Family Needs & Strengths Assessment with families of enrolled foster children.
- If a Foster Family has an enrolled biological child, they are required to be completed.

Foster Families

If a Foster Parent does NOT want to create an FPA, and does not have a biological or adopted child enrolled in the program:

- Change the Associated with to the Child's Name
- Enter "Foster- Not Required" as the Progress of the Family Goal.
- Save! You are done!

Foster Families

If a Foster Parent DOES want to create an FPA, and does not have a biological or adopted child enrolled in the program:

- Enter the date of enrollment when you introduced the FPA Process.
- Change the Associated with to the foster child's name.
- Enter "Introduced Process- Family Goal".
- Once the family sets a goal, Enter "Foster- Family Goal (Associate with child)" as the Progress.
- The "Family Outcome" box ALWAYS stays blank in this situation.
- Save and update as any other FPA.

If a Foster Parent has a biological or adopted child enrolled in the program:
