

Turn down your thermostat by 5 degrees to save 25% on your heating bills.

Have your furnace professionally cleaned and tuned every year.

Clean or replace furnace filter every month during heating season.

Don't block radiators with furniture, drapes, or other objects.

Open shades during the day to let in sun. Close at night to keep heat inside.

Lock windows. It tightens the seal to stop heat leaks.

COOLING

Close shades during day, or plant trees for heat reducing shade.

APPLIANCES

Water heater temperatures set at 120º- 130º are adequate for most households.

Install a water-saving showerhead to save \$40 a year.

A dripping hot water faucet can cost over \$35 a year. Fix it as soon as possible.

Turn off/unplug appliances that you're not using.

Keep dryer filters and vents clean. Dirty vents and filters slow air flow and uses more energy.

Don't vent dryers indoors. You add lint and pollutants, along with extra moisture in the air.

Wash full loads of laundry, using cold water wash and rinse.

Should I have my home insulated?

The answer is "yes" if you:

Have a home that has not been previously weatherized by AEOA, or has been weatherized before September 30, 1994

Are uncomfortably cold in the winter or hot in the summer; adding insulation creates a more uniform temperature and increases comfort;

Built a new addition or installed new siding or roofing;

Paid excessive energy bills.

Who is Eligible?

Homeowners and renters who are at or below 200% of federal poverty income (see income guidelines below), residing in Lake, Cook, or St. Louis Counties.

All homeowners and renter who have an "Approved" application from Energy Assistance are eligible for Weatherization services. If an Energy Assistance application has been "Denied", Weatherization is still available if the household is income-eligible as listed below.

Priority is given to households with at least one elderly person, or disabled person, or young children, and to customers with the highest heating costs.
