Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)



What is SNAP? SNAP provides food benefits to supplement your grocery budget so you can afford the nutritious food essential to health and well-being

Am I eligible for SNAP? Contact AEOA's Food Access Coordinator at snap@aeoa.org or 218-404-6050 to learn more or visit AEOA's website at www.aeoa.org/snap-enrollment.

How does SNAP work? If approved, you will receive benefits on an Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card each month.

You can use your EBT card to buy:

- Fruits and vegetables
- Meat, poultry, and fish
- Dairy products
- Breads and cereals
- Other foods such as snack foods and non-alcoholic beverages
- Seeds and plants, which produce food for the household to eat
